The 205th meeting of the Texas Surgical Society was held October 4-6 in Galveston at the Tremont House Hotel downtown, under the direction of **Local Arrangements Chair Team Colleen and Mike Silva**. 185 members, 5 Raleigh Ross Scholars and 7 guests registered for the Scientific Sessions.

On Thursday October 3, the Council met for its traditional afternoon session prior to the meeting.

On Friday morning, sporting events took place: Courtney Townsend directed the Golf Tournament at Moody Gardens Golf Course for 16 golfers. **Leigh Taliaferro** received the **Brindley Cup – Low Gross award**. The **Arlington Cup for Low Net** was again presented to **Bradford Scott**.

Patrick Walker hosted Sporting Clay Shooting at Texas City Municipal Shooting. There were 18 participants; **David Young took the trophy**.

Patrick and Marilyn Walker coordinated the Tennis Tournament at the UTMB Tennis Courts for 5 participants. The **Waco Cup** went to **Jeff and Lynne Stoltenberg** as the men's and women's winners respectively.

On Saturday morning, Mike Silva led 11 runners through the historic East End of Galveston and Seawall; Nathaniel Giles took the San Antonio Cup for speed; the Raleigh White III Award for style and dedication went to Joseph Karam.

The First Scientific Session began Friday at 1:00 pm with the call to order by President John Winter, IV, who moderated the session in the Davidson Ballroom Annex of the hotel. He introduced the LAC team who reviewed the social

event itinerary. The session proceeded with five member presentations followed by presentation of five Raleigh Ross Scholars; the Scholar Program was introduced by the President. Our Guest Scientific Speaker, Larry Hollier from New Orleans, gave his presentation entitled **“Charity Hospital: Memories of a Surgical Resident”**.

The Executive Session began at approximately 4:45 p.m. with a Call to Order by the President. Minutes of the previous Executive Session were unanimously approved.

Treasurer Dick Frazee gave the Treasurer's Report. The assets of the Texas Surgical Society were \$900,895 which reflected a \$12,000 increase from 2018. This increase was due to an increase in the Centennial Fund of over \$56,000 while operating funds decreased by \$37,000. While the reserves of the Texas

Surgical Society remain healthy, the ongoing trend of meeting expenses exceeding revenue was discussed again at the Council and an ad hoc committee appointed to study this trend. The Raleigh Ross Trust had funds of \$3,394,158 which represented a \$244,000 increase from 2018.

Dr. Lillian Kao was selected by the nominating committee as the new Treasurer and will begin that role in 2020. The mailing address for the treasurer and the Society will be 6341 Fannin Street, MSB 4.264, Houston, TX 77030. Dr. Frazee thanked the Society for the opportunity to serve as treasurer.

The Raleigh Ross Trust financial reports were given; the Trust assets were reviewed and are healthy. Trust awards were given to five recognized programs for Fall 2019, including the new addition of UTRGV to the program rotation.

The spending assumptions for the Society for the next year were reviewed as required by the IRS. We hope to continue aggressive monitoring of meeting expenses and will try diligently to decrease costs to defray spending deficits.

The Texas Surgical Society continues to use email for correspondence to the membership; the treasurer again stressed the fact that it is the responsibility of members to update their contact email changes online in the roster on our website and notify the secretary and treasurer of any changes.

Annual dues are payable by the first day of the first meeting of the year. Members will receive an invoice for dues via email at the first of each year. A second email reminder will be sent out prior to the meeting. The online website dues status feature for each member has been removed and will be maintained by the treasurer. Members in arrears are subject to forfeiture of membership.

Secretary Shannon Smith gave her report:

A current and future meeting overview was given. The ACS approved **12.25 hours of Category 1 CME for this meeting, 1.0 of which qualifies as Ethics. Members must have been a meeting registrant and in attendance during the Scientific Sessions (confirmed by having signed the attendance book each day) to be given electronic permission to obtain CME for the meetings!** The ACS-imposed date of CME availability and CME obtaining deadlines were reviewed.

Members were again strongly encouraged always to book rooms for each meeting through the TSS block of rooms, or with the hotel directly, as opposed to third party vendors, ie, online vendors. Third party-reserved rooms do NOT go toward our hotel-contracted room nights minimum; this costs the Society dearly in hotel financial penalty costs.

The History of Surgery Exhibit was again on display outside the Scientific Sessions; it will follow every meeting for now.

Our electronic transition is ongoing; New Member Applications are active on the online LINK, separate from the website. The process for New Member Applications is as follows: the Secretary sends the member sponsor and/or the applicant the LINK for the online app with instructions for completion and submission. We hope to correct missing new member roster photos at the time of the next roster printing Spring 2020. We are grateful for your patience in our electronic transition.

Chris and Heather Sherman were again able to provide superb A-V services for the meeting. **We want to continue to stress the need for timely submission of presentations by presenters prior to meetings, proper video saving and embedding technique and with fair warning to the A-V team if the presentation was created on a MAC! We will clearly outline these issues for all presenters well prior to submission deadline for all meetings, in order to avoid show problems.**

The report of the Council was given by Secretary Shannon Smith. The council is currently chaired by Michael Dragun. There are ongoing Council discussions regarding the critical need to contain cost of meetings while preserving quality of venue and food. We again used a ticket system at this meeting for hotel and other venue accountability of alcoholic drinks consumption; this is proving to be very effective at cost containment and accounting. We are tracking historical costs and meeting and events attendance headcounts in an attempt to control our ongoing spending deficit.

Mac Sykes' Council Report of the Archivist and Archivist Emeritus was reviewed: reminder: Mac Sykes' superbly written 101 year

book on the Society is free for all members who contributed \$2015 or more to the Centennial Fund, \$50 for other members, \$100 for nonmembers. It will be available for distribution at all meetings; we are hoping to avoid becoming a retail store at other times. Mac reminded us that our Society Archives are housed in Galveston at the well-funded Moody Library, under the direction of Medical Archivist Bobby Marlin, who is extremely helpful with pictures and presentations if needed over time. The Moody Library has been an excellent archival repository for Texas surgical historical information.

Membership Demographics were reviewed: Current statistics still indicate declining active membership and increasing senior membership. Eighty-five percent of membership is considered General Surgery. There are 517 members, 32 are non-resident, 4 are honorary. Member efforts in nominating qualified candidates in their respective communities is the most effective means of reaching the goal of building active qualified Society membership. Michael Dragun has researched current practice locations of previous Raleigh Ross Scholars; he produced a list which was disseminated to members; we will copy it to a mass Email to membership soon; please print it to have as a reference and consider sponsorship of qualified Scholars and other surgeons in your communities for Society membership!
